


Always Involved - Bayport Civic Association

Bayport-Blue Point Public Library Hosts Suffolk County Sheriff Errol Toulon, Jr. On Thursday, February 27



The Bayport-Blue Point Public Library & Johnny Mac Foundation, will co-sponsor "An Evening with Suffolk County Sheriff Errol Toulon, Jr." at 6:00 pm on Thursday, February 27.



Members of the public, including but not limited to teens are welcome to join the event. The program will be conducted in a question-and-answer format allowing many opportunities to have local questions answered.

Attendees must register beforehand by going online to www.bayportbluepointlibrary.org and using program code BPA672.

"The February 27 event gives the Bayport and Blue Point communities a valuable opportunity to discuss law enforcement issues with the county's top public safety

official," said Mike Firestone, Library Director. "It's also a great way to let Sheriff Toulon know about public safety-related matters concerning our local community."

As Suffolk County's highest-ranking law enforcement official, Sheriff Toulon has spearheaded a number of innovative programs designed to reduce crime and recidivism. Three highlights have been the Sandy Hook Promise School Safety Initiative, a Choose Your Path program directed toward young adults, and Deconstructing the Prison Pipeline, which focuses on the causes of juvenile delinquency and inter-generational crime.

Inaugurated into office on January 1, 2018, Sheriff Toulon is the first elected African-American Sheriff in the history of Suffolk County – and the first African-American to be elected to a countywide, non-judicial office.

He has made a practice of going to schools throughout Suffolk County on a weekly basis to talk with students about bullying, drugs, and gangs. As part of his campaign to "get to kids before they get to me," he encourages students to make positive life choices and also discusses how the paths he took in his own life led him to career success.

Sheriff Toulon, who previously served 22 years as a uniformed member of the New York City Department of Correction, earned a master's degree in business administration and a doctorate in Educational Administration from Dowling College.



Jack Flood is a local young man who has dreams of winning Olympic Gold for Team USA in the decathlon, a 10-event track and field competition this summer at the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo and/or at the 2024 Olympics in Paris. Jack graduated from Bayport-Blue Point High School in 2013 where he ran track and won a state championship. After high school, he attended SUNY Delhi and SUNY Cortland where he was a national champion 3 out of 4 years. Since college, Jack Flood has been competing around the country in the decathlon. This past year 2018-2019 was Jack's best year by far. He placed 3rd at the USA indoor championship in the Heptathlon and placed 8th at his first USA Outdoor track and field championship in the Decathlon. Because he placed in the top 10 at these USA meets, Jack was selected to compete in the Thorpe Cup held in Germany, representing the USA. Jack placed 4th at that meet, his first international track and field experience. Just two years prior he was an unknown Division 3 athlete far away from the level that he is at now. All Jack did was work hard and believe in himself. He achieved all this with limited coaching and while he was working. Imagine how much farther he can go now that he has a full-time coach and is solely focused on training. We believe he will be one of the top decathletes in the world one day and so does Jack. We have great faith in what he can accomplish with a little help from his community.

The Johnny Mac Foundation has a dual mission: to aid first responders, and to support the local community. The Foundation assists 9/11 first responders and first responder organizations and provides aid when needs arise in the local community. Community involvement includes helping neighbors in difficult financial circumstances as a result of unanticipated events. The foundation is named in honor of FDNY firefighter John F. McNamara of Blue Point. Mr. McNamara was a first responder who engaged in more than 500 hours of rescue and recovery work at the World Trade Center in the aftermath of the September 11, 2001 terror attacks. In

August 2009, he died at age 44 from cancer contracted as a result of his efforts.

As his health declined, Mr. McNamara had made a list of final wishes, including the desire to have a community center built in Blue Point. The Foundation's leaders said the center was also intended to serve as "a cornerstone of the community, family, and camaraderie."

In fulfillment of his wishes, the Bayport-Blue Point Library Board last August voted to lease the cottage on the former St. Ursuline Center property to the Johnny Mac Foundation. The Library purchased the property last year and will begin construction this spring on a new, expanded library facility.

"There were few things as important to John as his community. John was grateful to live in a community that cared so deeply about our kids, teens, and young adults," said Jennifer McNamara, the founder and president of the Foundation, who is also Mr. McNamara's widow. "The Bayport-Blue Point Public Library's devotion to community service aligns perfectly with John's vision of a better community. The Library is helping me to help make John's dream come true."

"John McNamara's personal courage was matched only by his love of the Bayport-Blue Point community," said Ronald Devine, library board president. "Everyone involved with the Library is proud to associate themselves with his inspiring example. It's very gratifying to be recognized by this wonderful, community-spirited organiza-

In addition to facilitating the creation of the community center, the Library has joined forces with the foundation to co-host events and programming that serve as platforms for community uplift.

Last September, Rohan Murphy – a nationally recognized youth speaker – gave an inspirational talk at the Library. In October, retired New York Mets All-Star Ed Kranepool recounted his seventeen-year career as a member of the "Miracle Mets," especially the 1969 World Series championship season. And in November, Bayport resident Ray Cooney – a retired firefighter and host of the popular TV show "Firehouse Kitchen" – shared both recipes and stories of firefighting heroism.



Besides the performers singing, dancing, and acting, there is a 50 piece


student pit orchestra, plus the stage crew, set design, hair and makeup.



At our February meeting we had Assemblyman Andrew Garbarino as our guest where he told us about the new State budget. With March and thoughts of Spring up next, our attention turned to our 17th annual St. Patty's Day Parade entry, along with a trailer full of enthusiastic Junior Civic members. As in past years, the Chamber outdid themselves in running the Parade which featured our very own Lenore Ringer-Prezioscas Grand Marshal. The BCA has long partnered up with the Aerodrome Society in doing all we can to maintain and preserve our Crown Jewel. Continuing with the Aerodrome theme, September marks the month of the Aerodrome Society's annual neighborhood picnic. As in past years, all the BCA members were invited for a day of fun amongst the smells of the barbeques and the sounds of the antique planes overhead.

September marked the beginning of our seventeenth year, and we had our new Senator Monica Martinez on hand for the event. The Senator told us of the new challenges and victories that came with her newfound office.

As Fall arrived, the Civic planned to host its annual "Meet the Candidates Night". In October we featured the candidates for the Town Supervisor, Town Council, Town Clerk, Town Tax Reciever and County Legislative races. The evening was highlighted by a lively question and answer session between those present and the candidates on a variety of issues important to our membership with 11 of the 12 invited candidates in attendance.

November's meeting included BBP Chamber of Commerce President Carol Seitz-Cusack, who filled us in on all of the Chamber's good works throughout the year. As the Thanksgiving and Christmas Holidays approached, the BCA geared up for their 16th annual Turkey Giveaway and Adopt-a-Family for the Holidays charity. We again partnered with the Bob Venero of Future Tech and were able to get turkeys out to those in need, totaling over eight tons distributed since we first began. We were also able to provide for a nice Christmas bounty for a few local families that otherwise would not have had one.

And so concludes another year of the Bayport Civic Association living up to our motto: Get Involved! On behalf of all the members of the Bayport Civic Association, I would like to wish everyone in our great Community a happy, safe and prosperous 2020.

Physical Therapy



health profession geared toward improving a patient's physical functions that may have been brought on by injury, illness, or congenital issues that interrupt Activities of Daily Living These ADL's can be simple tasks like getting in and out of bed, walking up and down stairs, cleaning around the house, doing laundry, or just being able to play with your kids/grandkids. Physical therapists use an individual's history during a detailed physical examination to develop a diagnosis and create a personalized management plan to use skilled treatment techniques in order to best treat the patient. The goal with physical therapy is to help the patient regain strength, mobility and overall independence as quickly and efficiently as possible. It is vital for the patient to put their trust in their physical therapist to maximize rehab potential

Physical therapists will teach patients how to prevent and manage their conditions in order to achieve long-term benefits. PT's will promote ways to enhance the ability to move,

reduce pain, restore function and prevent disability. Physical therapists use skilled techniques like manual therapy, joint mobilization, modalities (i.e.-electric stim, ultrasound, cold laser, etc.), therapeutic exercises, patient education, and more throughout the treat-

Physical therapy should be focused on individualized care and manual therapy, in combination with advanced treatment methods that are used with every patient to help them achieve their goals – often returning to a prior (or better!) level of function and a life without pain. Common issues patients go to physical therapy for include (but not limited to): lower back pain, sciatica, neck stiffness/pain, joint pain/stiffness (knee, hip, shoulder, elbow, etc), sports rehabilitation and balance issues; as well as pre & post surgical rehabilitation from joint replacements, sports-related injuries, or accidents.

The important thing to note is that physical therapy is a natural way to get better. There's no reason to rely on pain meds to get through the pain one may be having when physical therapy is an option. If there's something that is physically hampering the way of living that you're accustomed to, PT can get you back on your feet and have you doing the things you love to do.
