Nature as Nurture

At the start of the Covid-19 pandemic many people were seeking the refuge of the outdoors to release energy, stress, and plainly to find something fun to do. Being out and about in the natural world has a knack for nurturing the soul in ways that bring us back to life. Like many of us we found scenic roads, local beaches, or hidden winding paths to explore throughout a difficult time. One local Blue Pointer, Larry Glenn not only found a great way to enjoy nature with his dog, but also learned about the progress the new Bayport Blue Point Library was making.

If you have walked by the pre-existing building that housed St. Ursula's convent on Blue Point Avenue and peeked through the black privacy screen, you might see mounds of dirt and large construction vehicles that are hard at work renovating the space. What you might not see from the street view is that the landscape slowly began changing, but on a walk one day Glenn discovered something: "One day I noticed that painted X's had appeared on the stumps of a lot of trees. I walked around a bit and counted about twenty trees so marked. Most of these trees appeared to be in fair (or better) health and were nowhere near the building or the fence line. Like me, I'm sure many of you have admired the beauty, diversity and longevity of the trees that distinguish the property." The beautiful trees on the property as well as in the Bayport Blue Point Community are staples of elegance.

While driving down Blue Point Avenue there are a variety of trees and plants that decorate the verges and removing them would mean altering the visual landscape. Likewise removing trees would require an expert's advice. After doing additional research Glenn discovered, "That the Library had compiled the 'Tree Inventory Assessment' (which can be viewed on the Library's website) using the recommendations of a professional arborist as well as the requirements of the developers for improvements (parking, handicap access, mandatory septic upgrades, etc.). There are 119 trees on the property. Of the 119 trees in the summary, 37 trees were marked "REMOVE", and an additional 19 were marked "REMOVE?" (potentially to be felled either on the arborists recommendation or the necessity of their removal for improvements), so 56 trees going down on paper." At that point Glenn reached out to the library director, Mike Firestone who was helping with the plans and renovations. Together they were able to make some changes that would enable the preservation of more trees in relevant areas. "The bottom line is that of the 56 trees that would or could have been removed, 19 will be removed to allow for the necessary improvements," said Glenn.

It is with great excitement that onlookers can see the progress being made to the home of the Bayport Blue Point Library and while there is a sense of newness in the renovations, there is also a nostalgic subtle nod towards the visual beauty of the land. Thankfully local community members are working to conserve those elements that make our south shore a unique refuge. Albert Einstein once said, "Look deep into nature, and then you will understand everything better." What better way to understand things than by having a library marrying a natural sprawling landscape for our community to enjoy.




Girl Scouts Thank Veterans



During this time, he assisted a photographer sent by the Southern Poverty Law Center (SPLC) to document hate crimes in Suffolk County, and contributed photographs and testimony to their special report, Climate of Fear: Latinos Immigrants in Suffolk County (2009). Carlos was invited to be an exhibiting artist at SCCC's El Dia de la Raza (2006); published photographs and prose in Hybrido, a Spanish arts and literature journal (2008); and co-authored "On Hate Crimes" for the 11th edition of the same journal. He has been a guest speaker on Barricada, a weekly bilingual radio program on WPKN (89.5 fm). Carlos was honored as a recipient of the Equality Award given annually by the Suffolk Chapter of the NY Civil Liberties Union in 2010.







Hello readers,

With more ads and annoying pop-ups appearing in Windows with each new update you are probably starting to get sick of them. This week a reader wrote me about the ads that were popping up in the lower right screen of her computer called the notifications area. Each new update brings with it new and useful fea-

tures but also, Microsoft manages to sneak in more "suggestions"

To stop these ads or suggestions go to Settings then System and then Notifications and turn Notifications to off. Also uncheck any other boxes that are checked. To turn off things from the Start Menu, go to Settings and then Personalization and turn off Suggested Apps. Read through the choices and uncheck what else you don't want or need. You can also remove Lock screen ads by



going to Settings and Personalization, choosing Lock Screen, and setting Background to Picture or Slideshow. Also turn off Fun facts.

Taskbar ads are normally called "tips, tricks and suggestions". To shut them down go to Settings, System, Notifications and Actions and disable "get tips" as you use Windows. In a nutshell by accessing Settings from the Start button you will find a host of things you can do to customize your Windows experience and rid yourself of some of the Windows annoyances.

Now to remove ads in Microsoft Edge which is Windows built-in browser you simply need to access its settings. Open Edge and tap on the three dots at the top right of the window then choose Settings. Scroll down and select Site Permissions, then select Pop-ups and redirects and then slide off the toggle (>) next to Block Pop-ups

To block ads in Chrome, open Chrome and click its three dots on top right and choose Settings. Type pop into the Setting window at top of screen and click on Site settings. Under pop-ups it should say blocked. If it says allowed, click on Pop-ups, and redirects and turn off the Allowed switch

In closing, remember I am always available to offer advice, answer your questions, and access your PC remotely for repairs and tutoring. I am back to making house calls again with necessary precautions. I have added Smart Home Speakers such as Alexa and Google Home to my list of services from setup to automating your home. I can install your new equipment and can show you how to use them. I can also set up your Wi-Fi or wireless printing and show you how to use your new Smartphone. 


